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CLINICAL PERSPECTIVES OF MURVADI AGADA W.S.R. TO ITS THERAPEUTIC UTILITY

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ABSTRACT

A special and extremely powerful herbal remedy, Murvadi Agada is primarily recommended for the treatment of conditions brought on by disturbed Agni. The term "Garopahat Paavaka" refers to a condition in which interaction with Gara Visha causes Agni to become unbalanced. No other classical text contains this preparation, which is a special addition of the Ashtanga Karas. The right Anupanas, such as Ushna Jala, Takra, Mastu and Amla Rasa Dravyas, should be administered with Murvadi Agada. The complications of Gara Visha may occur when food is contaminated with harmful substances or side effects of Viruddha Aushadhi. Gara Visha can also contain processed meals, beverages, additives, preservatives and fast food. Numerous Agni Vikara including Arsha, Atisara and Udara Roga might result from the consequences of Gara Visha. Murvadi Agada may be helpful in treating such types of ailments when taken with the right Anupanas. This article describes clinical perspectives of Murvadi Agada with special emphasis to its therapeutic utility.

INTRODUCTION




Figure 1: Broad categorization of Agada Yogas.

In Ayurvedic toxicology, *Agada Yogas* are grouped based on their respective applications in managing diverse kinds of poisoning, like insect bites, snake bites and other intoxication conditions. They are also divided based on their respective actions as mentioned in **Figure 1**.

As mentioned above the *Vishaghna Agada Yogas* helps in the removal of toxins and *Visha Vega Agada Yogas* controls speedy spread of *Visha Vega*. Some *Agada* *Yogas* are also divided based on their specific actions as mentioned in **Table 1.**^[1-4]</sup>

Agada Name	Application
Dushivishari Agada	Applied in cases of conditions arises due to the Dushivisha.
Maha Agada	Applied to neutralize Visha vega.
Ajit Agada	Applied in cases of poisoning due to both Sthavar and Jangam.
Rishabha Agada	Used to treat poisoning from insects and snakes.
Vanshtwakadi Agada	Applied in Lutaadi vish.
Kushdaadi Agada	Specifically used in Trikantaka visha.
Rajnayaadi Agada	Given in Galgolika visha.
Kukumadi Agada	Used to treat Shatpadi visha.
Meshshringi Agada	Utilized in Mandook visha.
Dhavaadi Agada	Used in Vishambhra visha.

As mentioned above there are various *Agada Yogas* utilizes for specific therapeutic purposes mainly to neutralize health complications of poisons. *Murvadi Choorna* is one such preparation which offers therapeutic benefits in many ailments associated with toxins.

Ayurvedic drugs *Murvadi Choorna*, is recommended to \checkmark treat *Garopahata Paavaka* or digestive damage brought on by *Gara Visha*. Various *Anupanas* are used in \checkmark Ayurveda to enhance the effects of medications like \checkmark *Murvadi Agada*, especially in illnesses connected to *Agni* \checkmark *Vikara* and *Gara Visha*. *Murvadi Agada* facilitates the \checkmark elimination of *Ama* and *Meda*, increases *Deepana*, purifies the bladder and alleviates ailments like *Jwara*, \checkmark *Kasa* and *Swasa*.^[4-6]

Preparation of Murvadi Agada: Murvadi Agada ✓ contains following ingredients. ✓

- ✓ Murva Root
- ✓ Amruta Stem
- ✓ *Tagar* Rhizome
- ✓ *Pippali* Fruit
- ✓ Patola Root
 ✓ Cavva Root
- ✓ Cavya Root
 ✓ Citraka Roo
- ✓ Citraka Root
 ✓ Vacha Rhizom
- ✓ Vacha Rhizome ✓ Musta Tuber
- ✓ Musta Tuber
- ✓ Vidanga Fruit

These raw materials are ground into distinct powders using mesh of very fine holes. In a *Khalva* powders are sieved and blended uniformly at least seven times. The finished mixture packed tightly and exposed to light for two hours. It possesses shelf life of 2 years and can be used with different *Anupanas* according to the therapeutic utility.

Therapeutic Utility

It is especially useful in treating illnesses brought on by *Agni Mandhya* related with *Gara Visha*, an artificial poison made by combining a variety of toxic and non-toxic substances. *Murvadi Agada* has better therapeutic results when taken with the right *Anupanas*, such as *Ushna Jala, Takra, Mastu* and *Amla Rasa Dravyas*. It works very well for *Agni Vikaras* associated with food additives, junk food, preservatives and packaged drinks,

etc. It helps to treat diseases like Arsha, Atisara, Sthoulya and Udara Rogas.^[5-7]

Therapeutic Utility of Each Ingredient of *Murvadi* Agada^[7-9]

Murva relieves colic pain.

Guduci is antispasmodic, anti-inflammatory, stomachic, digestive and appetizer.

Tagara is carminative, stomachic and laxative.

Pippali is used as purgative, stomachic and digestive.

Patola is chiefly purgative in nature.

Cavya has digestive, carminative and stomachic properties.

Chitraka acts as a stomachic, carminative and anthelmintic.

Musta has stomachic and anthelmintic activities.

Vidanga is a digestive, stomachic and anthelmintic.

Vaca is antispasmodic, stomachic and antiflatulent.

Ayurvedic Properties of Each Ingredients Murvadi Agada^[7-10]

Murva is marked by Tikta and Kashaya Rasa, Guru and Ruksha Guna, Ushna Virya, and Katu Vipaka. It is Kaphahara, Pittahara, Vatahara, and Visaghna, useful in diseases such as Amadosha and Amlapitta, etc.

Guduci has Tikta and Kashaya Rasa, Guru and Snigdha Guna, Ushna Virya and Madhura Vipaka. It is Balya, Dipana, Rasayana, Jvaraghna and Tridosha Samaka and is used in Aruchi, Agnimandya and Amlapitta, etc.

Tagara shows Tikta, Katu, and Kashaya Rasa, Laghu and Snigdha Guna, Ushna Virya, and Katu Vipaka. It is Visaghna, Tridoshaharah and Manasadoshaharah employed in Agnimandya and Udara Shoola.

Pippali possesses Katu Rasa, Laghu, Snigdha, and Tikshna Guna, Anushna-Sheeta Virya, and Madhura Vipaka. It is Dipana, Hridya, Kaphahara, Ruchya, Recana, Vrishya, Vatahara, and Rasayana, beneficial in Ajeerna, Aruchi and Udarashoola, etc.

Patola possesses Tikta Rasa, Laghu and Snigdha Guna, Ushna Virya, and Katu Vipaka. It is Kaphapittahara, Vrishya, Varnya, and Dipana, and employed in Aruchi, Agnimandya, Ajeerna, Trishna and Amlapitta, etc. Cavya features Katu Rasa, Laghu, Ruksha and Tikshna Guna, Ushna Virya, and Katu Vipaka. It offers Dipana, Kaphahara, Pachana and Recana effects.

Chitraka manifests *Katu Rasa, Laghu, Ruksha,* and *Tikshna Guna, Ushna Virya,* and *Katu Vipaka.* It is *Shothahara, Dipana, Pachana* and *Kaphavatahara,* indicated in *Ajeerna, Agnimandya* and *Grahani.*

Musta is composed of Tikta, Katu, and Kashaya Rasa, Laghu and Ruksha Guna, Sheeta Virya, and Katu Vipaka. It acts as Dipana, Krimighna, Pachana and Pittakaphahara, used in Kaphapaittikavikara, Aruchi, Agnimandya and Ajeerna.

Vidanga gives *Tikta* and *Katu Rasa, Laghu, Ruksha,* and *Tikshna Guna, Ushna Virya,* and *Katu Vipaka.* It is *Anulomana, Dipana, Kriminasana* and *Vatakaphahara,* it is beneficial in *Krimidanta, Agnimandya, Ajeerna* and *Chhardi,* etc.

Vaca gives Katu and Tikta Rasa, Laghu, Tikshna and Sara Guna, Ushna Virya and Katu Vipaka. It is Dipana, Krimighna, Kanthya and Kaphahara, thus considered beneficial for Aruchi and Krimi.

CONCLUSION

In Ayurvedic toxicology, *Agada Yogas* are categorically grouped according to their therapeutic uses against the several forms of poisoning such as insect stings, snake envenoming, and intoxications. *Agadas* such as *Dushivishari, Maha Agada* and *Rishabha Agada* are designed to be used for specific effects against specific forms of *Visha*. Amongst them *Murvadi Agada* is a powerful drug especially useful in the treatment of *Gara Visha* related disorders and *Agnimandya*. Its carefully selected ingredients, each with particular *Deepana, Pachana*, and *Vishaghna* actions, synergistically interact to destroy *Ama*, rekindle digestive fire, and treat a broad spectrum of toxin-induced conditions.

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
