A CONCEPTUAL STUDY OF VICHARCHIKA WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE

ABSTRACT

All the skin diseases in *Ayurveda* have been described under the heading of '*Kustha'*, which are further divided into *Maha Kustha & kshudra kustha. Vicharchika* is one of the *Kshudra Kustha* runs a chronic course generally considered difficult to cure & even if it is cured relapses are common. It is characterized with symptoms, namely *Kandu* (itching), *Srava* (discharge), *Pidika* (vesicles), and *Shyavavrana* (discolouration). The clinical presentation of *Vicharchika* similar to eczema in modern dermatology. Eczema (also called atopic dermatitis) is characterized by dry itchy skin with areas of poorly dermarcated erythema and scale. In the acute phase eczema may be vesicular and oozing, in the chronic phase it may become hyperpigmented and lichenified (thickened). Excoriations (scratch marks) are frequently seen. The modern science has greatly advanced, particularly in dermatology but there is no specific medicaments for sure cure of eczema but symptomatic treatment like antiallergic, steroids are used but they produce serious side effects like nephrotoxicity, osteoporosis, skin cancer etc. Ayurveda offers treatment for the root of eczema by cleansing vitiated *dosha* and balancing the *dosha* and *dhatus*. In *Ayurveda* main line of treatment of this disease is *Shodhana, Shamana* and *Rasayana therapy*.

- Astanga Hridaya- He has described Vicharchika under Kshudra Kushtha (A.H.Ni.14/18)

NIDANA

Factors responsible for the pathogenesis of disease are called Nidan. Knowledge of the nidan helps in the prevention of the disease.

Though there is no specific description about etiological factors of vicharchika but it is being variety of kshudra kushth, the etiological factors are accepted as the etiological factors of the Vicharchika.^[14]

Nidan of Kushth and hence of one of its sub typ may be classified into following groups:

- 1. Aharaj Nidana
- 2. Viharaj Nidana
- 3. Aacharaj Nidana
- Aharaja Nidana Virudha Ahar, Excessive and continuous use of Nav-Anna, Dadhi, Guda, Tila, Mulak, Matsya, and excessive intake of Amla and

Lavan Ras Paradhan Dravya etc.

- Viharaj Nidana
- 1. Drinking cold water after fear, exhaution or sunlight.
- 2. Suppression of urge of Mala, Mutra and Vaman.
- 3. *Vyayam* and *Atap Sevan* just after taking excessive amount of diet *Divaswapna* etc.
- *Mansika Nidan*: *Atishoka, Krodha, Bhaya, Santap, Irshya, Dwesha* etc.
- *Krimi*: Many Acharya accepted *Raktaj Krimi* as aetiological factor of *Kushtha Roga*

CLASSICAL DEFINITION OF VICHARCHIKA

• Acc to Charaka Samhita

सकडू: पिड़का श्यावा बहसावा विचर्चिका ॥ (च.चि.7/26)

It is a skin ailment wherein eruptions over the skin appear with dark pigmentation, itching and with a profuse discharge.

• Acc to Sushruta Samhita

राज्योऽतिकंडूवर्तिरुजः सरुक्षा भवन्ति गात्रेषु विचर्चिकायाम् | (स्.नि.5/13)

It is a condition in which the skin has linear rough lesions with intense itching and pain but when the same itching, burning and pain are experienced in the feet alone, it is termed as "*Vipadika*".


There is no illustration regarding the premonitory sign and symptoms of *Vicharchika* in the text, but as it is classified as one of the *Kshudra Kushtha roga*.

Infestation by parasites, gaping lesion with profuse discharge, erethymatous eyes and loss of voice. Out of above stated complication, *Arochaka, Avipaka, Jwara, Daha* and *Daurbalya* may be found in *Vicharchika, Nidranasha* due to severe itching it seen. It may be regarded as one of the *Upadravas*.

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
